

Background story:

Lesley writes In July 1997 we celebrated the graduation of our youngest daughter, Catherine and just one week later my husband, Brian, sustained diffuse brain damage. A moment's inattention as he crossed the road resulted in his head impacting with the wing mirror of a passing large van.

The initial relief that he had survived the accident was replaced by awareness of how ignorant we were.

So many of you will know how it feels to spend hours by a hospital bed not knowing whether to let him rest or try to stimulate him and if so, how best to go about it.

There were many stressful incidents during his time in hospital but I know from talking to you and your families that you too have your own memories of times you would prefer to forget. However, I did find it particularly distressing and shocking when I was told that medically Brian did not need to be in hospital any longer BUT, at that time, there was no residential rehabilitation service available anywhere near. Sadly, only a short time after this, in February 1998, Brian died, still in hospital. The Inquest took place 15 months later.

Whilst Brian was in hospital I had joined Headway as a life member. After his death I learned that Leonard Cheshire had plans to establish a dedicated ABI Rehabilitation Centre in Goole Hospital. I became a volunteer helping to raise over £380,000 and was so happy when the service opened. It is now run by North Lincolnshire Hospitals Trust.

I was keen that families should benefit from the services and information Headway already produced and helped start Headway Hull + East Riding. As you know, we have regular get togethers, some just social but some with speakers, we publish this Newsletter sending it out to many families, supporters and health professionals across the county. From 2006 onwards a number of members have spend an afternoon with the psychology students at University of Hull giving them an idea of what life was like before ABI and how it has impacted on life since. We have held a number of one-day seminars and been able to call upon wonderful speakers. We tap into Headway services, including the free clinically led helpline, brilliant range of fact sheets and booklets, the I.D. cards, Headway News quarterly magazine, free webinars, etc. etc. ...

I am particularly proud to be involved with the Approved Provider Accreditation Scheme which The Department of Health asked Headway to set up. To date there are 60 ABI Rehabilitation services accredited under the scheme, which is open to residential care settings. This includes NHS and independent hospitals, neuro-rehabilitation units, residential and nursing homes and respite facilities, specialising in acquired brain injury (ABI). We want everyone to have access to services to enable them to achieve the best quality of life.

Over the years members and friends of Headway Hull + East Riding has held many fund raising events and our daughters have helped too. Amongst other things Catherine, along with 3 friends, donned pink boiler suits, pink wigs and masks to become "Pigs in Wigs", driving a suitably decorated old VW from Paris to Krakow, Alison completed a skydive, Alison, son Austin and I took part in a sponsored bike ride organised by our local Rotary Club.

All of the above is leading up to the fact that this July marked 25 years since Brian's accident. Alison and Catherine, will be running the London Marathon for Headway in his memory and in memory of our friend Sue Kyle.


