Improving life after brain injury


Important news about how we contact you



As many of you will know, the law on how data is stored and used has recently changed. This includes the way that charities and businesses can contact people.

As a branch, we have been working hard to make sure that we comply with the new requirements, and we sent an email to all our members just before the law changed to confirm that we were keeping their data safe, and there was nothing else that they needed to do.

Keeping members and contacts updated with our newsletter is at the very heart of what we do because it helps us to:



- Provide support to those people whose lives have been touched by brain injury
- Improve communication and understanding with professionals who provide services in our community, and


