
Diary and look ahead

There will be a debate on Acquired Brain Injury in Parliament on Thursday, 9 May 2019. This is another excellent opportunity to raise the profile of ABI, the needs of survivors, families and carers, the fantastic work we do in your branch and the gaps in services which need to be filled. The after care being a major concern and the theme for our training event planed for late October.

It would be so helpful if you could contact your local MPs to let them know about the debate and ask them to attend/take part. It's also a good chance to make contact which could lead to further support for your branch.

You may remember the debate last year which saw lots of positive mentions for Headway groups and branches. Many MPs also spoke about their own experience of ABI.

The debate has been arranged thanks to the tireless efforts by Chris Bryant MP who chairs the All-Party Parliamentary Group on ABI. Every 90 seconds someone in the UK is admitted to hospital with an acquired brain injury (ABI). The effects of ABI can last a lifetime and have an impact on every aspect of life.
